On Sunday 3rd November, students from 7/8MC participated as performers in the Goulburn Oratorio. As a result, the class became saviours of the Oratorio's centrepiece; the 10 foot tall puppet Alice. Armed with water pistols and dressed in camouflage, the boys raced on stage and dispersed a crowd of outraged sporting performers and clowns who had surrounded Alice. Then, in an effort to more fully engage with spectators at the event, the boys turned their attention and their water pistols on the audience.

The boys thoroughly enjoyed themselves and were genuinely excited to be part of such a huge event. It was great to see the students taking in the other acts and performing with such enthusiasm.



Bush Fire Appeal

The bushfires that occurred late last month in the Blue Mountains, left 202 homes destroyed with the owners and their families not only homeless but without any possessions. This included all personal belongings and school uniforms and equipment. The school that was most affected was Winmalee High School in Springwood. After this dreadful event the SRC and Prefect body approached Mr Purcell with an aim to support the students at Winmalee. At the same time the Year 9 MAP, under the guidance of Mr Stephens, came up with a scheme to provide packs of school equipment for affected students. Consequently, the whole school community was involved in raising these funds. The P & C donated \$500.00, the student body contributed \$1000.00 and the staff gave \$500.00. \$2000.00 has now been sent to Winmalee High School to help support students, not just for the immediate future, but for the coming 2 years. 9 MAP continue to raise funds for their school packs. This has been an outstanding response and the whole school should be justifiably proud of the way we have responded.
